On behalf of Endometriosis Australia, I was privileged to attend the World Congress on Endometriosis in Edinburgh last week. I want to personally congratulate Professor Luk Rombauts, outgoing President of the World Endometriosis Society and a Member of our EA Clinical Advisory Committee, and his team for organising an extraordinary meeting of minds to share exciting research findings.

I am thrilled to share that **Sydney has been formally announced as the host of the 2025 World Congress on Endometriosis.** I'm excited to be appointed to the Organising Committee, led by our Endometriosis Australia Co-founder Professor Jason Abbott (UNSW) and Professor Gita Mishra, from The University of Queensland. Representing the Peak Body for Endometriosis in Australia, I will also coordinating the World Endometriosis Organisations (WEO) sessions on patient centred care with its steering committee. Also of interest is that our co-founder Donna Ciccia's Masters degree study on INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' EXPERIENCE AND UNDERSTANDING OF MENSTRUAL HEALTH, was shared at the Edinburgh Congress by Dr Cecilia Ng and we are pleased to acknowledge Aunty Kerry Doyle's guidance. First nations people need and deserve better access to diagnosis, medical and allied services, mental health and support. Endometriosis Australia is developing a program to assist.

We look forward to sharing our progress with the **Endometriosis Nurse Fund**, our **Workplace Assistance Program Endo@Work**, along with other initiatives under development to better support EndoWarriors through peer support, advocacy and education of health practitioners including GPs, allied and complementary health practitioners, and the wider multicultural community.

Our continuing investment in research aims to speed up diagnosis of endometriosis and its sister adenomyosis through less invasive methods, to learn about beneficial and cost-effective ways to manage symptoms, and ultimately, to find a cure for this life-defining disease.

We will be sharing our **Patient Participation Program** with you soon and inviting EndoWarriors to become formally involved in academic, medical, social and workplace research studies.

We also welcome your input from onset of symptoms, to testing, diagnosis and validation, through medical procedures, fertility challenges and ongoing management. As an 'Endo Mum' I also understand how challenging it be for the family, the workplace and the community as a whole. Endometriosis Australia is here to represent the needs of endometriosis sufferers through every age and stage.

#### DO YOU HAVE ENDOMETRIOSIS AND LIVE IN VICTORIA?

## We are seeking adults who would like to test a novel intervention involving medicinal cannabis

In this study you will be assigned to one of three groups:

- > Group 1 will receive cannabidiol (CBD) oil
- > Group 2 will receive CBD oil + vapourised (i.e., inhaled) cannabis flower
- > Group 3 will receive placebo oil

You will also complete several online questionnaires and provide updates on your health and symptoms via an app over **27 weeks**. If you:

- √ have endometriosis (confirmed either via laparoscopy, MRI or ultrasound)
- √ live in Victoria
- √ are 20 years of age or older
- presented to the emergency department for symptoms related to your endometriosis 2 or more times in the past 6 months

Please note that you will not be able to drive a car for up to 4 months while participating in the study. Your participation is voluntary, and you may stop at any time.

Curious about medical cannabis and endometriosis?

The 'EndoCannED' trial will look at whether prescribing medicinal cannabis instead of opioids can reduce emergency department presentations for people with endometriosis.

As well as analysing change to emergency department presentation rates, the study will examine participants' pelvic pain severity, general symptom severity, analgesic usage, fatigue, and health-related quality of life changes.

If you have a confirmed diagnosis of endometriosis, are aged 20 and over, live in Victoria, and have presented to an ED two or more times in the last 6 months for pelvic pain-related symptoms you may be eligible to participate.
